Around this time last year when the pandemic was completely not out of the picture, our Children's Healthcare Center staff worked diligently to take our medically fragile children to the movies after more than two years.

Our staff worked very closely with the theater staff to ensure our children were safe in the process. Due to their hard work, the children were able to watch the movie from a designated space while following strict safety protocol. To add a little fun to their experience, our staff made sure the children wore shirts that depicted their heroes in the movie. The children and staff enjoyed the immersive theater experience and many laughs were heard.

Our staff's persistence and strength carried the programs through the challenges of the pandemic and these two admirable traits bring to mind another story of a mother who possesses the same qualities. She sought out the services of our Maryville Crisis Nursery for her four-year-old daughter so she can attend her graduation at a local university. Her story does not end there. Facing all kinds of adversities, this mother completed her bachelor's degree while living at a domestic violence shelter in Chicago, a shining example of how our programs' critical services come through for families in need of help.

The efforts of our staff do not come unnoticed. A mother who completed her recovery program at Saint Josephine Bakhita Homes sent a letter to our staff, saying in part:

**"I just want to say thank you guys for everything. Your generosity touched my heart during one of the darkest times of my life.** You guys have shown me nothing but brightness, love, and light. You are my family forever. Even when everything feels more hopeless, painful and lonely, angels like you guys reminded me that the world can still be beautiful. I have grown so much and got my independence back. # Success Story

## Alum credits Maryville for shaping her life, for being 'still here'

When Vachel White was asked to describe her life now as a headline, she paused briefly, thought about it for a moment, and said, "I am still here."

White, an alum who came to Maryville in Des Plaines in the summer of 1987 when she was 12 years old, shared what it was like growing up before and after coming to Maryville.

She arrived at Maryville during the annual Maryville awards banquet where everyone from different sites, including children and staff, gathered under an outdoor tent.

"On the first day, I got to see that with good behavior and grades, I could earn a new bike, a large boom box or money as reward," she said. "I was happy to be at Maryville and not another foster home."

White lived at Maryville for seven years and recalls being a "pretty good student and became a great athlete." She said that she spent a lot of time at the gym learning various sports from Maryville's Coach Ed Strabel.

"I got to go to the Michael Jordan camp for two years in a row at Elmhurst College because I was pretty good at basketball," she said. "Maryville had so many opportunities for me to do well as a ward of the state of Illinois."

She further describes living on campus as safe and visually beautiful. "I recalled lots of therapy sessions were spent walking around the manicured campus which was soothing to me," she added.

Before Maryville, White lived in four foster homes, was expelled in fifth grade and suffered behavioral issues due to abuse and trauma.

"I was angry and at 12 years old, I told myself no more homes," she said.

White credits Maryville for shaping her into what she is today. "Maryville shaped me into an independent orphan where keeping a structured routine is key," she said. "We were in school all year round and if we were not, we were in some kind of summer camp, worked a job or we volunteered."

She said that Maryville kept her on a strict schedule. "I looked out for myself and it was a great independent experience," she said. White attended the local junior and high schools while at Maryville.

"Maryville had the most committed staff and administration to take care of me," she said. "I felt the love so I did well in the end even after being a difficult teen."

White singles out going away to an overnight summer camp in northern Wisconsin and the yearly visits to Six Flags Great America which she said was a huge deal as two of her most memorable memories at Maryville.

She earned a sports scholarship to Olivet Nazarene University and graduated with a degree in social justice in four years. While grateful for the achievement, she recalls her challenges during that time.

"Those four summers were very difficult because I was homeless until school started back in the fall because Maryville was not my home anymore," she recounted.



After graduation, she experienced a full-circle moment when Maryville hired her as a family educator, her first job right after college. Her responsibilities then included taking 10 boys to camp, which she said she loved.

White has worked as an early childhood educator for the last 20 years and takes care of 10 families and 10 children in one of the suburbs north of Chicago. She sees them once a week and checks on them. "I bring them good things," she said. "I do that because nobody did that for me. I want to do it for them."

She also coaches youth sports while working as an early childhood educator.

"Vachel has always been enthusiastic with everything that she does. She is an amazingly resilient woman with an infectious smile," said Coach Strabel.

Right below the headline where it says, "I am still here," White's story continues with a picture of the 12-year-old girl who is now a woman and whose life is dotted with successes and big dreams.

"I am a passionate and sensitive survivor of abuse and neglect whose adult mission has been to make sure children birth to 5-years-old are safe and protected by somebody like me," she said. "I am the loudest fan in the gym who cheers and coaches kid sports."

"I am good at what I do," White said. "I am hardworking, loving, concern about families and a nice lady."

White said she draws inspiration for her life now from a Martin Luther King, Jr. quote, "If I cannot do great things, I can do small things in a great way."

"That's me," White said. "A 40-something orphan who is organized, one who sets high expectations for herself while keeping a structured routine because this is what Maryville taught me."

# Maryville Crisis Nursery

The Crisis Nursery is an innovative program designed to help parents or guardians get through stressful times

The Maryville Crisis Nursery is a vital and innovative program that provides free short-term care for parents in distress and experiencing a crisis. The Crisis Nursery protects their children, birth to age six, from abuse, neglect or trauma.

Children receive round-the-clock child care for up to 72 hours for each stay. This safe and nurturing environment is designed to protect them from harmful experiences and the damaging effects of trauma. Issues that bring families to the Maryville Crisis Nursery include domestic violence, unemployment, medical issues, parental illness or hospitalization, poverty, parental stress and homelessness.

# Family Behavioral Health Clinic

FBHC helps children and adults heal

The Family Behavioral Health Clinic provides behavioral health services, substance use disorder counseling, DUI Risk Education classes and treatment, fulfilling requirements from our menu of Court-Ordered Anger Management Services and counseling to children and adults in the Chicago area. Our mission is to help heal individuals and families through the use of comprehensive evaluations and therapeutic counseling. We strive to improve family dynamics and strengthen the bonds of the family to pave the way to a better future.

We welcome patients of all ages. The Family Behavioral Health team has extensive experience in the treatment of child psychosis and behavioral issues including trauma-impacted disorders, depression, anxiety, attention deficit disorder (ADD), attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), school avoidance and self-harming behaviors. Our substance abuse treatment team provides evaluations and counseling for alcohol, drugs or to meet the Illinois State requirements in response to a DUI or other issue.

The 2021-2022 school year was filled with challenges, accomplishments and much pride in our students' growth. The year started with a new social-emotional learning curriculum that reinforced what our social workers and counselors are doing in the classrooms as integral members of the classroom team.

Our transition and career technical education students returned to community job sites, working with the Des Plaines Park District doing maintenance jobs and with the Des Plaines Community Foundation, installing wheelchair ramps. Field trips were also part of the curriculum again, starting with trips to the ropes course early in the school year.

This year's awards ceremonies documented our students' hard work and dedication to their academics, as more students earned the A and B honor roll this year than in previous years. We also saw this dedication during PSAT testing, as students worked hard on their exams. The challenges this year were lessened by the dedication of the faculty, the flexibility of the students, and the patience of our parents and guardians. Ann Craig, principal and director of educational services, said she is filled with much gratitude for the faculty and staff's guidance and assistance this year.

# Casa Imani/ Saint Mary of Celle

Casa Imani and Saint Mary of Celle provide a nurturing home for expectant and parenting young women

The Casa Imani program, located on our Eisenberg Campus in Bartlett, IL, is a therapeutic residential home for parenting and pregnant adolescent girls, ages 13 to 20 and their babies, with a history of childhood trauma and intellectual disability and mental illness. The program focuses on parenting skills training and support services to increase resilience and change the course of young women's lives and their children. Treatment at Casa Imani is designed to build stable, consistent and healthy relationships with staff, foster healthy regulation of emotions, and build social, emotional, behavioral and spiritual resources for the young girls.

Saint Mary of Celle is an extension of the Casa Imani program. This program addresses the special needs of pregnant and parenting young women who are at-risk, their children and families. It will prepare young women for the transition to a temporary or independent living environment. In addition to providing safe housing and vital assistance related to school, counseling, life skills training, health services and case management under the Casa Imani program, Saint Mary of Celle will provide additional resources around parenting and career development with an emphasis on keeping these young families together in a comprehensive and holistic way.

# Children's Healthcare Center

Our dedicated staff prepares children and their families for a successful transition from care to home

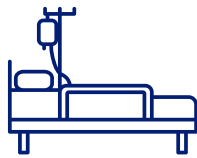
Our Children's Healthcare Center provides care for medically fragile and/or technology-dependent children, ages newborn through 21 years.

Most children are admitted from a hospital NICU or PICU. This program focuses on patients who no longer require acute care, but who need significant medical attention related to wound therapy, PICC antibiotics, post-surgical care, NG, GJ tube feedings and ventilator care. The Center is a "home away from home" for medically fragile children and their families.

Our 16-bed facility offers child/adolescent-friendly and welcoming rooms. There are separate rooms for physical therapy, learning, eating and play, as well as rooms for parents to stay overnight.

## **Maryville Golf Academy**

Serving the Maryville mission through the opportunity for vulnerable children to learn about the game and its many life lessons

In the spirit of tradition and excellence that Saint Mary's Training School (renamed Maryville Academy in 1950) started in 1883, the Maryville Golf Academy teaches children and young adults' skill sets and life lessons and building their character to prepare them for a brighter and successful future.

Established in 1994, the Maryville Golf Academy offers children and young adults the opportunity to work, play and practice at neighboring facilities. It continues its growth and outreach, serving hundreds of children, youth and young adults that would otherwise not have the opportunity to learn and grow in the game.

The Maryville Golf Academy develops them as players, caddies or clubmakers. They learn to play golf as well as the values and lessons inherent in the game that are embodied by Maryville and the Maryville Golf Academy founders, such as etiquette, respect, honesty, perseverance, responsibility and sportsmanship.

# Catholic Youth Organization

Offers the children and young adults of Chicago and nearby suburbs in Cook and Lake counties a sports environment that is safe and nurturing

The Catholic Youth Organization was founded in Chicago in 1930 to provide the youth with a safe place to play and participate in organized athletic competitions. CYO's mission is to bring youth together, foster strong relationships in families and communities, and help them lead more fulfilling and rewarding lives through sports.

The Maryville CYO program sponsors organized athletic programs throughout the year, notably basketball, cross country, track and field and cheerleading, utilizing facilities such as Catholic schools, YMCA, Chicago Park District and Chicago Public Schools.

Each year, approximately 3,000 youth, ages 8 – 19, participate in CYO events in the Chicago area. Maryville sponsors and directs this program on behalf of the Archdiocese of Chicago. It is open to young people of all faiths.

# Saint Monica & Saint Josephine Bakhita Homes

Offering parenting and pregnant women hope for a better and successful life

The Maryville Academy Mother's Recovery Home Network is comprised of two Maryville recovery programs: Saint Monica Homes located in the West Town neighborhood of Chicago. It is a residence for up to 18 women between the ages of 18 and 35 and their children up to age 10. Saint Josephine Bakhita Homes, located in the Austin neighborhood of Chicago, can follow Saint Monica Homes where mothers and their children experience a less restrictive home setting. The goal at Saint Josephine Bakhita Homes is to allow mothers to focus on gaining independence and putting into practice the life skills they have learned.

Women admitted to the programs will receive individual and group treatment designed to help examine their mental health, emotional, medical, neurobiological and socioeconomic conditions. Once an assessment is completed by a Maryville Family Behavioral Health Clinic staff, specific treatment plans will be assigned to address the unique needs of each woman. Mothers will have the opportunity to engage with a parenting coach and participate in classes. A vocational coordinator will work with each mother in a workforce development program and provide job-readiness training. Substance abuse treatment and mental health therapeutic services will be offered through the Family Behavioral Health Clinic.

# Saint Dominic Savio & Saint Teresa of Calcutta Homes

Offering boys and girls life skills for a successful transition back with their families and communities

Saint Dominic Savio Home for boys and Saint Teresa of Calcutta Homes for girls provide clinical care and life skills education for young men and women ages 14 to 18 who have been released from the custody of the juvenile justice system. These transitional, residential home-like settings help foster social, coping, interpersonal and vocational skills. The goal is to successfully transition participants to return home and to become productive members of their communities, free from further delinquency.

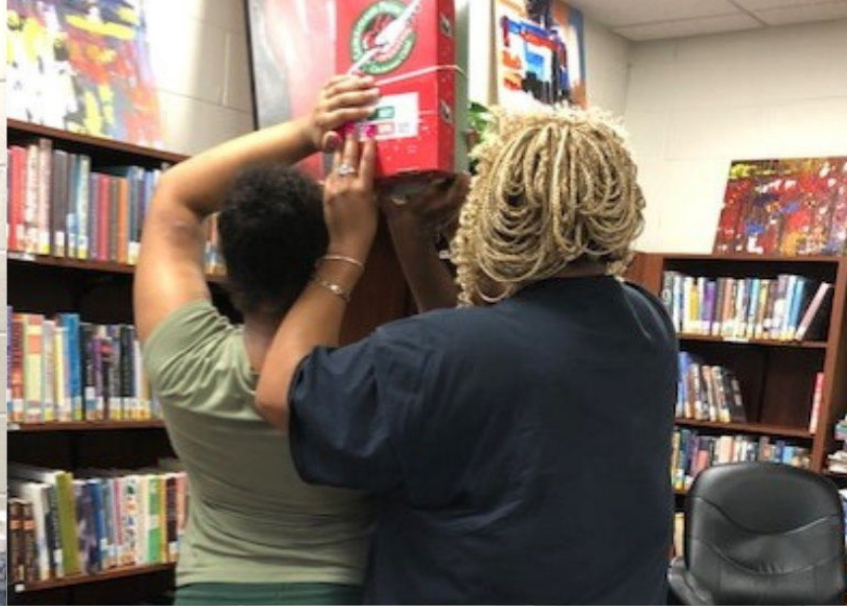
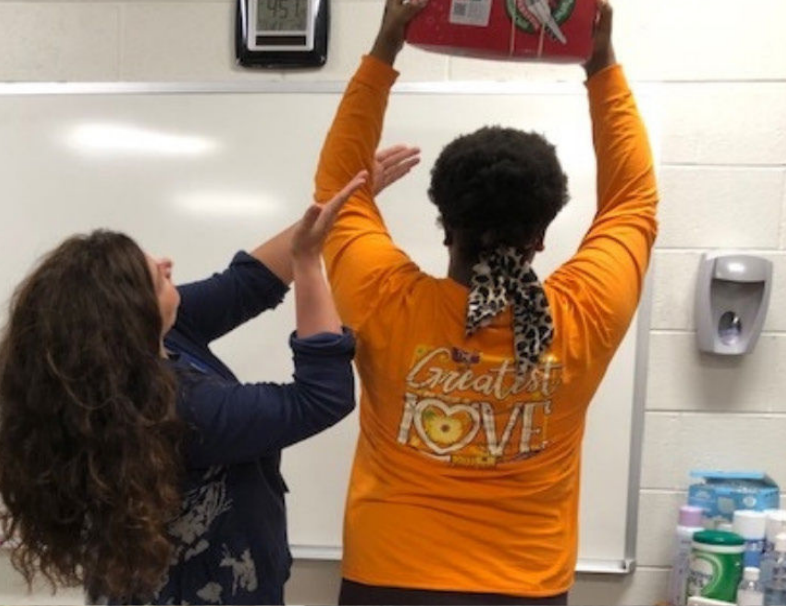

**RESIDENTIAL SERVICES**  
**Casa Salama**

A program for girls who are taught life skills to prepare them to live independent lives after experiencing trauma and neglect

Casa Salama is a safe and supportive home for girls diagnosed with intellectual and mental disabilities. The residential service program helps girls, who mostly have faced trauma or abuse, develop the skills that will allow them to live independent lives. They undergo treatment to help them build stable, consistent and healthy relationships. They are given multiple home responsibilities and are taught coping tools to help them deal with their emotions. Residents participate in a therapeutic day school, clinical groups, recreation and vocational activities.

# Jóvenes Adelante Services (Children Moving Forward)

Maryville provides therapeutic residential programs for children and young adults in Bartlett, Chicago and Des Plaines. Every child in the Jóvenes Adelante Program (children moving forward) receives the support of Maryville staff who work to meet their physical, social, psychological, educational and health needs. Services include trauma-informed care, individual/group counseling, access to medical care, case management, multi-disciplinary education, and opportunities for recreational, cultural and religious activities.



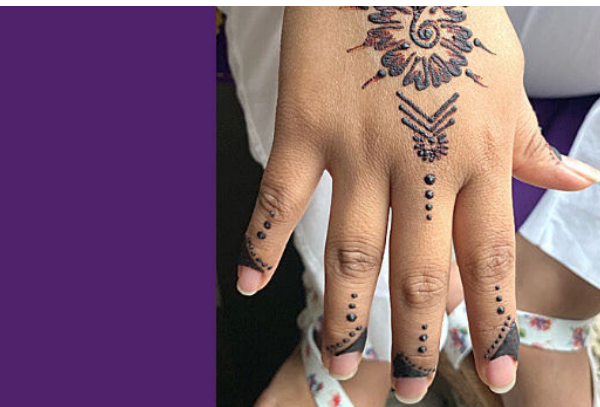

### **Gifts of Cash**

In 2022, individuals who don't itemize on their tax return can benefit from a \$300 tax deduction (for couples a \$600 deduction is allowed). Those who do itemize are allowed to deduct up to 100% of their adjusted gross income.

Beyond gifts of cash, there are many creative ways to make a gift to benefit Maryville's children and families—ways that may also help you.

### **Gifts of Securities**

Outright gifts of stock that have been held longer than a year benefit from the avoidance of tax on the capital gain while also offering a charitable tax deduction for the present fair market value.

### **Gifts from Retirement Accounts**

If you are 70 ½ or older, you may directly transfer your required minimum distribution or up to \$100,000. Although a tax deduction is not available, the transfer will not count as taxable income.

### **Gifts from Donor-Advised Funds**

Donor advised funds are an excellent resource to consider when making a gift to us. Call our office to learn more about the advantages of creating such a fund.

### **Gifts of Life Insurance**

By creating a change of beneficiary form, you can make the Maryville Academy a full, partial or even contingent beneficiary of your policy.

### **Savings Bonds**

Designate that your savings bonds come to the Maryville Academy through your estate plan. Unlike family members or others, no taxes will be owed upon our redemption.
