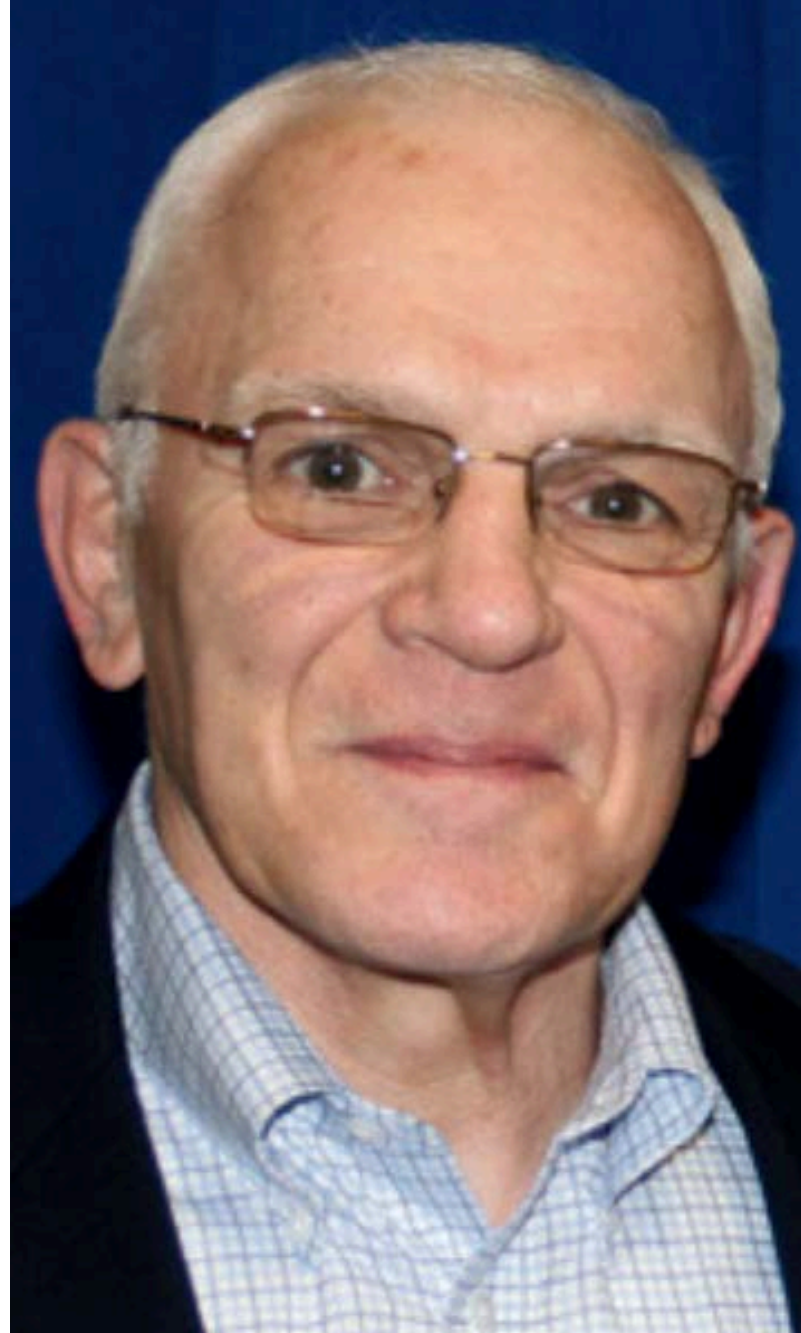

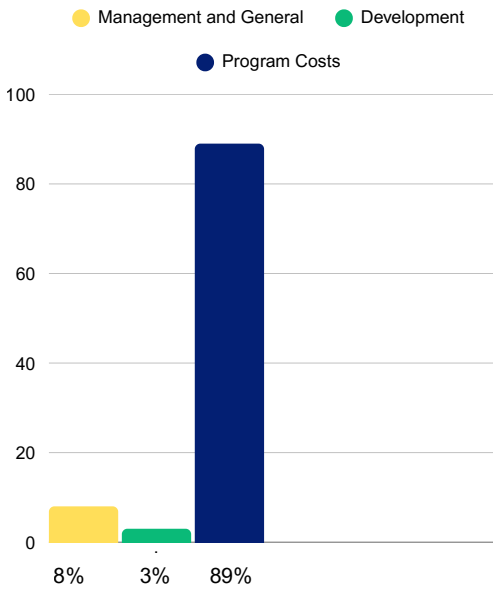

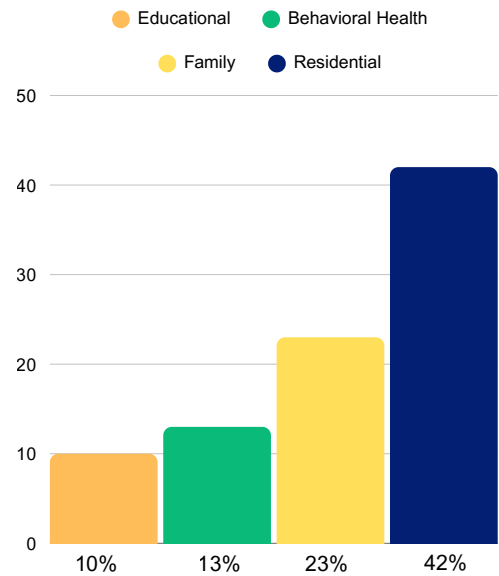

FY2025

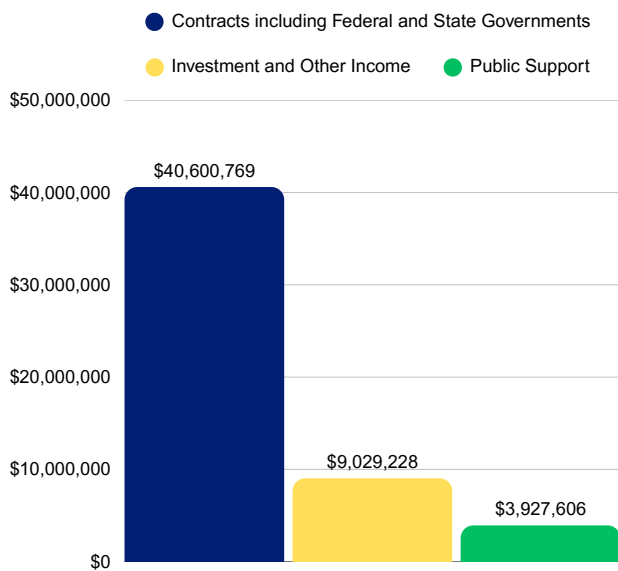
## Total Expenses - \$57,311,083

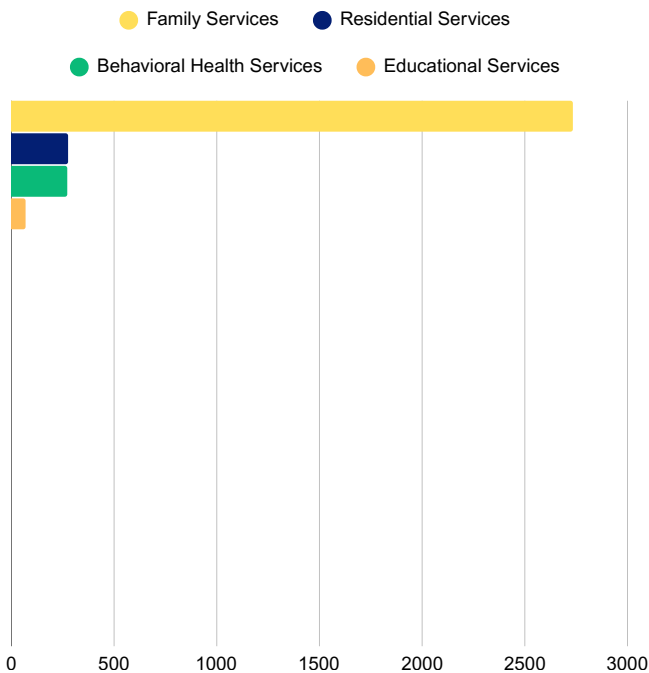

# Mission in Action: Family Services

Strengthening families. Restoring stability. Preventing crisis.

Families come to Maryville at pivotal moments. Some are navigating unexpected hardships. Others are rebuilding their lives after instability or trauma. Through our Family Services programs, we walk alongside parents and caregivers, helping them regain confidence, stability and hope.

The **Children's Healthcare Center** provides care for medically fragile children from newborn to 21. This program focuses on patients who no longer require acute care, but who need significant medical attention related to wound therapy, PICC antibiotics, post-surgical care, NG, GJ tube feedings and ventilator care.

The **Maryville Crisis Nursery** offers immediate, short-term care when families need a safe place for their children while they address urgent challenges. For many parents, this support prevents situations from escalating and allows them to focus on employment, housing, medical needs or personal well-being. What begins as temporary relief often becomes a turning point toward long-term stability.

At the **Maryville Child Development Center**, early childhood education provides more than classroom readiness. Children gain structure, nurturing relationships and the foundational skills that prepare them for academic success. Parents gain peace of mind, knowing their children are in a safe, enriching environment while they work or attend school.

**Saint Catherine of Siena** serves as a transitional, community-based shelter for children from newborn to 21 with complex

medical needs who are in the custody of the Department of Children and Family Services. The program ensures 24-hour high-quality support from skilled nurses and experienced youth care staff who bring a compassionate philosophy to their daily work.

The **Catholic Youth Organization**, founded in Chicago in 1930, provides a safe place to play and participate in organized athletic competitions for Maryville and Chicago's children and young adults. CYO's mission is to bring youth together, foster strong relationships in families and communities, and help them lead more fulfilling and rewarding lives through sports.

Established in 1994, the **Maryville Golf Academy** offers the children of Maryville and those in underserved Chicago neighborhoods the opportunity to be developed as players, caddies or clubmakers. Celebrating 32 years, it continues its growth and outreach, serving hundreds of children, youth and young adults that would otherwise not have the opportunity to learn and grow in the game.

Maryville's family-centered approach recognizes that lasting change happens when caregivers are supported alongside their children. Parenting education, resource referrals and individualized service plans empower families to build sustainable routines and healthy relationships at home.

Through prevention, education and compassionate care, Maryville's Family Services carry hope forward by helping families remain together, stable and supported.

# Mission in Action: Education

Educating minds. Nurturing hearts. Shaping futures.

Education at Maryville is transformative. At Walsh Academy, students with unique learning and emotional needs receive individualized instruction within a therapeutic environment designed for success.

Small class sizes and integrated clinical support allow teachers to meet students at their academic level while addressing social and emotional development. This whole-child approach creates a space where students feel understood, respected and capable.

Career and technical education programs provide hands-on learning opportunities that prepare students for meaningful employment. From vocational training to job-readiness skills, students gain practical experience that builds independence and confidence.

For Michael, he found invaluable experience in the skilled trades through an auto mechanics internship with Niles Public Works. This was an area that aligned perfectly with his interests and training at Walsh. Through this internship, he learned to diagnose, maintain and repair municipal vehicles, while gaining a firsthand understanding of what it means to be part of a professional team.

Michael's drive, focus and work ethic were a true reflection of

what was possible when students are supported, guided and empowered with practical learning experiences. His success was a testament to the impact of vocational education and the importance of strong community partnerships.

"Seeing our students apply their skills outside the classroom is one of the most rewarding parts of our vision," said Dr. Ann Craig, principal of Walsh Academy. "Michael is a shining example of how real-world experience transforms potential into purpose."

For many students, progress is measured not only in grades but in growth. Increased attendance, improved self-regulation and renewed motivation signal breakthroughs that once seemed out of reach. Each milestone represents a shift from challenges to possibility.

Families also benefit from educational support. Regular communication, collaborative planning and resource coordination ensure that learning continues beyond the classroom and into the home.

Through academic excellence and therapeutic care, Maryville's educational services equip students with the skills, resilience and determination to build their futures. We carry hope forward by helping every child discover their potential.

# Mission in Action: Behavioral Health

Healing mind, body and spirit.

Behavioral health support is essential to long-term well-being. Maryville's **Behavioral Health Services** address the emotional and psychological needs of children and families through accessible, compassionate care.

Licensed clinicians provide individual therapy, family counseling and assessment services tailored to each client's needs. Early intervention and consistent treatment reduce barriers to stability and prevent challenges from becoming crises.

Our integrated model ensures that behavioral health is not isolated from other services. Collaboration between clinicians, educators and residential staff creates continuity of care, reinforcing progress across environments.

Under the Behavioral Health Services is the **Family Behavioral Health Clinic**. It provides mental health services, substance abuse counseling, and DUI Risk Education and counseling to children and adults in the Chicago area and the Maryville Academy Mother's Recovery Home Network.

Its mission is to help heal individuals and families through the use of comprehensive evaluations and therapeutic counseling. We strive to improve family dynamics and strengthen the bonds of the family to pave the way to a better future.

The **Maryville Academy Mother's Recovery Home Network**

is comprised of two Maryville recovery programs: **Saint Monica Homes** located in the West Town neighborhood of Chicago. It is a residence for up to 18 women between the ages of 18 and 35 and their children up to age 10.

**Saint Josephine Bakhita Homes**, located in Chicago's Austin neighborhood, can follow Saint Monica Homes where mothers and their children experience a less restrictive home setting. This program allows mothers to focus on gaining independence and putting into practice the life skills they have learned.

## Success Story

When a mother of three graduated from the recovery home program at Saint Josephine Bakhita, she was asked what she would miss the most and she had this to say.

"It helped me grow and be more independent. While I admitted to feeling nervous about the transition, I am excited to continue building a new life for me and my children," she said.

The staff shared words of encouragement and support for her next steps. Several staff members became emotional as they expressed how proud they were of her progress and perseverance.

"She's come such a long way," said one staff member. "Watching her grow into a confident and capable mother has been an inspiration to all of us."

# Mission in Action: Residential Services

A safe place to heal, grow and prepare for the future.



For some children and youth, stability begins with a safe place to call home. The programs under Maryville's residential services provide structured, trauma-informed care for young people who cannot safely remain in their current living environments.

Within our residential homes, youth find more than shelter. They find caring adults who offer consistency, accountability and encouragement. Daily routines create predictability. Counseling and individualized treatment plans address emotional and behavioral needs. Education and life-skills development prepare youth for independence.

Programs such as **Saint Dominic Savio Home** and **Saint Teresa of Calcutta Home** focus on holistic healing. Staff work closely with each child to rebuild trust, strengthen coping skills and develop healthy relationships. For many youth, this is the first environment where they experience sustained stability.

Youth admitted to the programs may be enrolled in an approved therapeutic day school. High school-aged youth can be enrolled at Charles H. Walsh Sr. Academy & Career Tech High School.

These residential programs center on empathy, resilience building and trauma-informed care. Maryville employs the Attachment Self-Regulation and Competency (ARC) model which is a comprehensive framework designed to meet the needs of youth with complex trauma histories.

Community integration is an essential part of the residential experience. Youth participate in school activities, vocational training and service opportunities that help them reconnect with the world beyond their circumstances. These experiences foster confidence and a renewed sense of belonging.

This fiscal year, our youth demonstrated measurable growth in academic engagement, emotional regulation and social development. Several transitioned successfully to family placements, independent living or step-down programs with continued support.

Maryville's residential services provide the structure and compassion that allow healing to take root. By meeting the youth where they are and guiding them forward, we carry hope into lives that need it most.

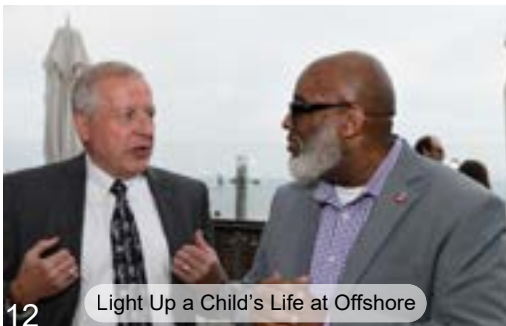

If you are 70 ½ or older, you may directly transfer your required minimum distribution or up to \$108,000. Although a tax deduction is not available, the transfer will not count as taxable income.
